President's Report

The Spring 2009 meeting will be held Friday - Saturday March 27-28 at Delta Community College. Kris Baumgarten and Audra Swarthout of Delta have taken the lead in organizing this meeting whose topic that promises to be both interesting and timely: The One Health Initiative: The Interrelationship between Humans, Animals, and Pathogens.

Dr. Kimberly Signs of the Michigan Department of Community Health will deliver the Friday evening talk, "Zoonotic Diseases: The Convergence of Animal and Human Health". Kimberly Signs, DVM, is a zoonotic disease epidemiologist in the Division of Communicable Disease at the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH). (http://www.michigan.gov/emergingdiseases)

On Saturday, Laura Kramer, Ph.D. will present a talk entitled "The Global Emergence of Mosquito-borne Viruses". Dr. Kramer, an ASM Branch Lecturer, is a Research Scientist at the Wadsworth Center, Zoonotic Disease and Clinical Virology, New York State Department of Health. She is also an Associate Professor of the Department of Biomedical Sciences, Immunology and Infectious Disease, School of Public Health, University of Albany, State University of New York. Dr. Kramer's research interest as part of the Arbovirus Laboratories, focuses on studies examining the interaction of mosquito and tick-borne arboviruses, arthropod vectors, and vertebrate hosts, and how this interaction impacts the transmission cycle of the pathogen. The research program includes studies with alpha- and flavi- viruses, examining intrinsic (genetic) and extrinsic (temperature, dose, time after infection) factors affecting vectorial capacity. Studies also include molecular epidemiologic studies of West Nile virus; the development of new assays for arboviruses in mosquito pools and vertebrate tissues; and mosquito genetics.

of Science in Food Safety Program at Michigan State University and an Associate Professor of pre-harvest food safety in the Department of Large Animal Clinical Sciences in the College of Veterinary Medicine. PhD professor and author, died on October, 14, 2008 in Atlanta, GA after undergoing a hospital procedure. Professor Jay received his MS and PhD in Microbiology from the Ohio State University and his BS from Paine College in Augusta, GA. He taught at Southern University, and Wayne State University, where he retired after more than 30 years on the faculty. He also served as Adjunct Professor at the University of Nevada Las Vegas. Professor Jay is survived by his wife of 49½ years, Patsie Jane Jay, three children: Mark Jay, Alicia Jay White, and Byron Jay and four grandchildren. He is also survived by three siblings, Gertrude Henley, Rev. Lewis W. Jay, Joseph Jay, two daughtersin-law, one son-in-law, a host of nieces and nephews, many students and dear friends. Dr. Jay has authored two books and co-authored 150 papers, chapters, and other publications. The publication, Modern Food Microbiology, is in its seventh revision. This publication has been translated into Spanish, Mandarin, Hindi, and Chinese.

Dr. Jay has been a Member of IAMFES since 1982. In 1995, he presented the Ivan Parkin Lecture at the Opening Session of the IAMFES 82nd Annual Meeting. He has served on the editorial board of Journal of Food Protection and is the former Associate Editor-in-Chief of the International Journal of Food Microbiology. Dr. Jay is a Fellow of ASM, IFT, the American Public Health Association, and most recently, IAMFES. In recognition of his achievements in research and teaching and of his contributions to the quality and reputation of the graduate programs, he was the recipient of the 1992 Distinguished **Graduate Faculty Award from** Wayne Status University, James Jay was a veteran of the U.S. Army.
